The tug of war rope is marked with a colored ribbon or tape at the center, and this center mark must align with a marker on the ground.

Pulling Technique:

Participants use a hand-over-hand pulling technique. The rope must pass through their hands, and the hands should not be interlocked. Specialized footwear may be used to enhance traction.

Starting Positions:

Teams start with the rope taut and upright, with all team members behind the starting line.

Referee Commands:

The referee gives commands to start and stop the pull. The start command initiates the pulling action, and the stop command is given when a team has pulled the opposition across the center marker or a predetermined line.

Winning the Pull:

The team that successfully pulls the opposition a specified distance or over a marked line is declared the winner of that pull.

Tug of war emphasizes fair play and sportsmanship. Teams are expected to compete within the rules, and any violation may result in penalties.







Board Setup:

The game is played on an 8x8 square board.

Each player starts with 16 pieces: one king, one queen, two rooks, two knights, two bishops, and eight pawns.

Piece Movement:

The king moves one square in any direction.

The queen can move diagonally, horizontally, or vertically any number of squares.

Rooks move horizontally or vertically any number of squares.

Bishops move diagonally any number of squares.

Knights move in an "L" shape: two squares in one direction and then one square perpendicular to that.

Pawns:

Pawns move forward but capture diagonally.

On their first move, pawns have the option to move forward two squares.

Pawns can promote to any other piece (except a king) when they reach the eighth rank.

Check and Checkmate:

The object of the game is to checkmate the opponent's king.

Check occurs when a king is under attack. The player must make a move to remove the threat.

Checkmate is when a king is in check, and there is no legal move to escape the threat.

Stalemate:

A stalemate occurs when a player has no legal moves and is not in check. The game is a draw.

Draws:

Draws can also occur through insufficient material, threefold repetition, the fifty-move rule (no pawn moves or captures in the last fifty moves), or agreement between the players.

Castling:

Castling is a special move involving the king and a rook. It can only be done if neither piece has moved before, there are no pieces between them, and the king is not in check.

En passant:

Pawns have the option to capture en passant if they move two squares forward from their starting position and land beside an opponent's pawn.

Chess Clock: In tournament play, a chess clock is often used. Each player has a set amount of time to make all their moves.







Turns:

Players must pocket one of their carrom men into any pocket with each turn.

Foul lines: Striker must be placed within the front lines while striking.

No contact: If the striker fails to hit any carrom men on the board.

Striker in the pocket: If the striker is pocketed.

Queen:

The queen is a special carrom man, usually the red one.

Players must pocket a carrom man after pocketing the queen.

If a player fails to do so, the queen is returned to the center of the board.


